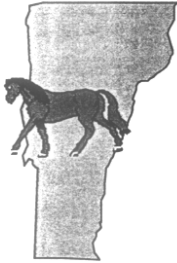

TOWN OF RANDOLPH VENDOR'S ORDINANCE

Pursuant to Title 24, section 2291 (9) of the Vermont statutes annotated, the Selectboard of Randolph hereby adopts the following Ordinance regulating and licensing itinerant vendors, peddlers, door-to-door salesmen, and those selling goods, wares, merchandise or services who engage in a transient or temporary business, or who sell from an automobile, truck, wagon or other conveyance, excepting persons selling fruit, vegetables or other farm produce, which Ordinance is for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety and welfare and for the convenience of said town. This Ordinance replaces all of the former Vendor/Peddler's Ordinances passed in the Town and Village of Randolph. On its effective date, sixty days after its adopted date of January 7, 2003, this Ordinance replaces the former Peddler's Ordinance passed in the Town and Village of Randolph.

It will take effect on Saturday, March 8, 2003, unless a petition signed by at least five percent of the voters of the Town of Randolph is filed with the Town Clerk by 4:30 PM on Friday, February 21, 2003, asking for a vote to disapprove the ordinance. If the petition is received, the Town of Randolph's Selectboard will warn a special meeting and the voters may vote on that question.

VENDOR'S ORDINANCE

Pursuant to Title 24, section 2291 (9) of the Vermont statutes annotated, the Selectboard of Randolph hereby adopts the following Ordinance regulating and licensing itinerant vendors, peddlers, door-to-door salesmen, and those selling goods, wares, merchandise or services who engage in a transient or temporary business, or who sell from an automobile, truck, wagon or other conveyance, excepting persons selling fruit, vegetables or other farm produce, which Ordinance is for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety and welfare and for the convenience of said town.

Section I—Definitions:

- A. The words "itinerant vendor" is used in this Ordinance shall be construed to include both principals and agents who engage in a temporary or transient business in Randolph selling goods, wares, merchandise or services and who, for the purpose of carrying on such business, hire, lease or occupy a building or structure for the exhibition and sales of such goods, wares, merchandise or services, or who, for the purpose of carrying such business sell, hawk or peddle from vehicles or on the street, but shall not apply to the sales made to dealers of retailers or manufacturers by commercial travelers or selling agent in the usual course of business.
- B. The words "peddler" and door-to-door salesmen" as used in this Ordinance shall be construed to include principals and agents who travel from town to town or place to place within a town, whether or not such persons shall have a regular place of business, and who offer to sell or barter, or do sell or barter, goods, wares, merchandise or services but shall not apply to sales made to dealers or retailers or manufacturers by commercial travelers or selling agents in the usual course of business.

SECTION II—Regulations:

- A. Before commencing business, and itinerant vendor, peddler, door-to-door salesman or a person selling goods, wares, merchandise, or services who engages in a transient or temporary business, or who sells from an automobile, truck, wagon or other conveyance, except such persons selling fruit, vegetables, or other farm produce, shall obtain a license from the Town Manager.
- B. The application for such license shall be sworn to, shall disclose the names and residences and the owners or parties in whose interest such business is conducted, shall disclose persons who will be conducting such business and shall be kept on file by the Town Manager. Application shall be made on a form provided by the Town Manager.
- C. The application shall be filed with the Town Manager together with an application fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) and there upon the Town Manager shall issue to the applicant a license, setting forth a copy of the application, and authorizing him/her to do business in the Town for a period on one (1) year from the date thereof. One such application shall be made and license issued for each such persons to do business except herein below set forth.

- D. For events of one to three days (1-3) in duration, the applicant shall pay a fee of ten dollars (\$10).
- E. Such license shall not be transferable, however, such licensee may have the assistance of one or more persons conducting his/her business, who shall have the authority to aid him/her, but not to act for or without him/her.
- F. No person shall advertise the commencing business or sales regulated hereunder without first obtaining a license under this section.

SECTION III—Exceptions:

- A. This Ordinance shall not apply to solicitations by nonprofit clubs, groups or organizations nor persons soliciting for same.

SECTION IV—Penalties and Enforcement:

- A. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be fined not more than Three Hundred (\$300) Dollars for each offense. Each day the violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. Waiver of this fine shall be in the amount of One Hundred Fifty (\$150).
- B. Any person violating this Ordinance may be enjoined from taking and doing such actions as violate this Ordinance upon application for an injunction by the Town of Randolph as provided under Vermont law.


Section V—Amendment:


- A. This Ordinance may be amended as provided under the laws of the State of Vermont.

- A. If any provision, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, its invalidation shall not affect with out the invalid provision, and for this purpose the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared servable.
